### Investment Strategy

The investment seeks to maximize long-term return on capital. The fund employs a "value approach" in making its common stock selections. Under normal market conditions the fund invests at least 80% of its net assets, plus the amount of any borrowings for investment purposes, in securities of small-cap companies. The fund considers small-cap companies to be those issuers that, at the time of initial purchase, have a market capitalization that is within or below the range of companies in the Russell 2000 Index as of the latest reconstitution. The fund may invest in securities of both domestic and foreign issuers. The fund's policy of investing at least 80% of its net assets in small companies may only be changed upon 60 days prior notice to shareholders.

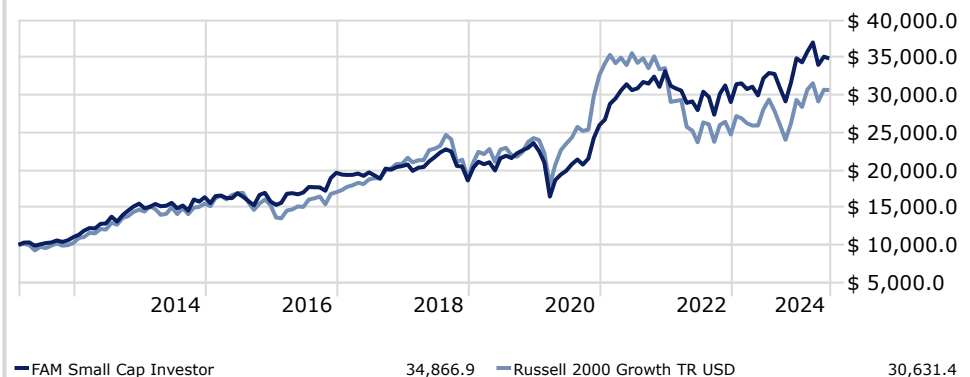
*Disclosure: The Fund's total annual operating expense ratio as stated in the fee table of the Fund's most recent prospectus is 1.25% for the Investor Class. The Fund's total annual operating expense ratio as stated in the fee table of the Fund's most recent prospectus is 1.15% for the Institutional Class. When excluding Acquired Funds Fees and Expenses, which are not direct costs paid by the Fund's shareholders and fee waivers, the total annual operating expense as reported in the FAM Small Cap Fund's audited financial statements for the Investor Class is 1.24% and the Institutional Class is 1.14% as of December 31, 2023. The Advisor has contractually agreed, until May 1, 2025, to waive fees and/or reimburse the Fund certain expenses (excluding interest, taxes, brokerage costs, Acquired Fund Fees and Expenses, dividend expense and extraordinary expenses) to the extent necessary to cap Net Fund Operating Expenses for Investor Shares at 1.42% and Institutional Shares at 1.20%.*

<p><b>Alpha</b> is a measure of the difference between a portfolio's actual returns and its expected performance, given its level of risk as measured by beta. <b>Sharpe Ratio</b> is a risk-adjusted measure calculated by using standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk. <b>Sortino Ratio</b> is similar to Sharpe Ratio except it uses downside risk (Downside Deviation) in the denominator. <b>Standard Deviation</b> is a statistical measurement of dispersion about an average, which, for a mutual fund, depicts how widely the returns varied over a certain period of time. <b>R-Squared</b> reflects the percentage of a portfolio's movements that can be explained by movements in its benchmark. <b>Beta</b> is a measure of systematic risk with respect to a benchmark. <b>Max Drawdown</b> is the peak to trough decline during a specific record period of an investment or fund.</p>								<p>The Morningstar Rating<sup>SM</sup> for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for funds with at least a three-year history. (Exchange-traded funds and open-end mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes.) It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a fund's monthly excess performance (excluding the effect of sales charges, if any), placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance.
